Future in Focus – Atlantic Career Development Framework Career Cruising



How Career Cruising Aligns with Framework Goals

The following document shows you how to implement the Atlantic Career Development Framework for Public Education at your school district through Career Cruising. It also demonstrates how Career Cruising helps meet each of the framework goals based on how they're organized – programs, students, and educators.

• PROGRAMS

- Goal 1: Support career development using a coordinated, whole-school approach organized by career development themes.
 - Career Cruising offers a full-school approach with its **BILINGUAL K-12** career development programming.
 - Students are able to transition from elementary school to middle school to high school while maintaining their saved career development progress.
 - o Career Cruising supports educators with 30+ detailed classroom activities and projects.
 - Educators benefit from an administrative portal to organize their career development resources and track student progress.
- **Goal 2: Implement age-appropriate career development programs, services, or supports.**
 - Career Cruising includes a K-2 module and 3-5 module (both in the Spark! elementary program), learning games centered on career development with integrated portfolio activities.
 - Career Cruising has a 6-12 digital portfolio where students can take assessments (interests, skills, learning styles); research careers and post-secondary programs and schools (including technical schools, colleges, universities); build their resume; prepare for job searching and interviewing; and more.
 - Career Cruising features a high school course-planning module, which helps students align their high school plan with their postsecondary goals.
 - Career Cruising has a financial literacy program recommended for students in grades 7-9 (The Real Game) and grades 10+ (The Be Real Game).
 - Career Cruising has an Inspire module that connects students with local employers and career coaches so they can explore workplace learning activities.

• STUDENTS

- > Goal 3: Promote career development as an integral part of student learning.
 - Career Cruising can be integrated as part of student learning in multiple classrooms from K-12, and offers classroom activities on both the student platform and in the educator portal.
 - Students can save career development work (including assessment results, careers of interest, post-secondary programs, journal entries, uploaded files, links, etc.) in their My Plan digital portfolio as they progress through school.
- Soal 4: Ensure that every student graduates with a career plan.
 - Every student from grades 6-12 has access to their Career Cruising digital portfolio to help them set goals and build their personal career plan.
 - Career Cruising's comprehensive K-12 career development program means students can start exploring their interests and thinking about careers at an early age.



- Goal 5: Provide multiple opportunities for students to engage in community-based/experiential learning.
 - With Career Cruising's The Real Game and The Be Real Game financial literacy programs, students role-play as adults in the workforce and learn what it's like to manage expenses and budgets. Students also have to plan how much time they'll dedicate to work, commuting to work, leisure activities, sleeping, housework, etc.
 - With Career Cruising's Inspire program, students have access to local community partners who can offer experiential learning opportunities like internships, co-op placements, job shadows, company visits/tours, and part-time jobs. This is a great opportunity for students to engage in community-based experiences and discover opportunities based on their interests and local labour market demands.
- EDUCATORS
 - Goal 6: Provide professional learning for educators to ensure effective and engaging career development opportunities for students.
 - Career Cruising's administrative portal, CAMS, is exclusively for educators and lets them organize students in groups, assign students to their advisors, and send messages to students and parents/guardians. Educators can also assign homework and projects to students and access classroom activity guides to supplement career curriculum.
 - Career Cruising's Inspire program connects industry and education to create exciting opportunities for students. Within the administrative portal, educators can easily communicate with participating employers and coordinate workplace learning activities for students. They can also print reports on Inspire activity (e.g., the students who have participated in discussion boards with volunteer career coaches or saved workplace learning activities to their portfolio.)
 - Career Cruising offers several reports for educators so they can see how students are using the program and what directions they're exploring. Report examples: student learning styles by type, saved careers, saved colleges and universities, saved post-secondary programs and career clusters, portfolio completion, and more. These reports can help educators organize college and university visits, plan for guest speakers and career fairs, and more.
 - Educators have access to on-demand recorded tutorials and live webinars that explain how they can use different areas of Career Cruising. Complimentary in-person and Web-based training sessions are also available for districts depending on trainer availability.

Goal 7: Ensure access to timely, reliable, and relevant career and labour market information.

 Career Cruising's Inspire program allows students to connect with employers in their community and ask volunteer career coaches questions about their industries and whether the job market is favorable in certain industries. Through this program, students have access to timely career and labour market information, and can see what companies are looking for when it comes to future employment opportunities.




